- 1 Thin Ice**
1814*. [River Thames Tideway, London.](#)
The Doctor visits the last great frost fair and discovers something lurking beneath the frozen Thames.
- 2 The Mark of the Rani**
1830's. [Killingworth, North Tyneside.](#)
The Doctor tangles with the *Rani* and the *Master*, but prevails with help from George Stephenson.
- 3 The Snowmen**
1842. [London.](#)
The Doctor thwarts the plans of the *Great Intelligence* and its ice creatures.
- 4 The Next Doctor**
1851. [London.](#)
The Doctor meets a man claiming to be a future incarnation of the Doctor and foils a *Cyberman* plot.
- 5 The Evil of the Daleks**
1867. [Harrow Weald, Middlesex.](#)
The Doctor appears to collaborate with the *Daleks*, but instead inflicts them with the Human Factor.
- 6 The Unquiet Dead**
1869. [Cardiff.](#)
The Doctor encounters corpses reanimated by gas-like alien entities and meets Charles Dickens.
- 7 Tooth and Claw**
1879. [Torchwood House, Scotland Highlands.](#)
The Doctor saves Queen Victoria from a *Werewolf* and warrior monks.
- 8 Ghost Light**
1883. [Perivale, London.](#)
The Doctor takes his companion to a mysterious mansion to banish her childhood fears.
- 9 Timelash**
1885. [Scottish Highlands.](#)
The Doctor teams up with HG Wells to foil the machinations of the despotic *Borad*.
- 10 The Talons of Weng Chiang**
1889. [Limehouse and Westminster, London.](#)
The Doctor foils the plans of *Magnus Greel*, an infamous 51st century war criminal.
- 11 The Crimson Horror**
1893. [Sweetville, Yorkshire.](#)
The Doctor almost becomes the victim of a parasitic red leech in an apparently idyllic community.
- 12 Horror of Fang Rock**
1902**. [Fang Rock, South Coast.](#)
The Doctor saves a lighthouse crew from a shape-changing *Rutan* scout.

* Yes, we know it's Regency and not Victorian, but we couldn't resist including it because the Doctor wears a top hat!

** 1902 is slightly too late for the Victorian period, but 1902 is only an estimate and it could easily have been a year or two earlier. Anyway, it's a lovely period piece.
